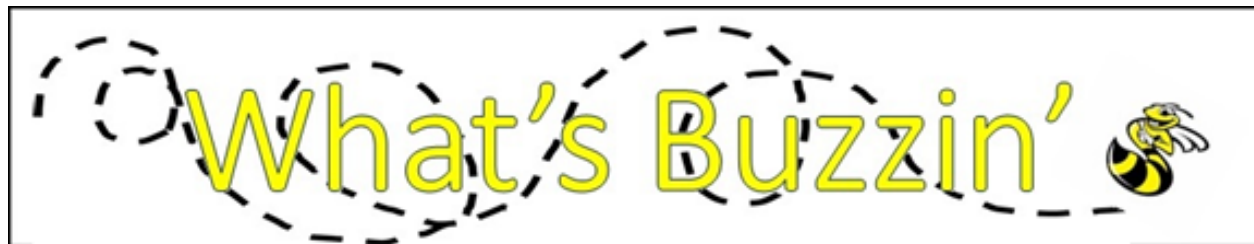

Reading to Rover

Have your children talked to you about reading to dogs at school? Chances are they've had the opportunity to read to our therapy dogs on campus? The dogs wear blue bandanas and their handlers wear blue vests which identifies them as a therapy dog team. Sinsheimer has hosted the Reading 2 Rover Program for 5 years. Reading 2 Rover (R2R) is part of San Lucia Open Dog Obedience Group (SLODOG) whose member teams have passed the qualifications to visit local schools. The dogs "listen" to the children read books. A certified therapy dog's "job" is to engage with those he/she is visiting, by providing comfort, joy, unconditional love, to those in need. A therapy dog is one who has identifiable character qualities such as being calm, confident, enjoys interacting with people, is intuitive to the needs of those around him, gets along well with other pets, and is not timid or aggressive. The dog is bonded to his/her handler in such a way that he/she is responsive and obedient. Not all dogs can do this important job. R2R therapy dogs can lower student's stress levels, decrease anxiety, increase positive moods, ease social isolation, help students learn social skills, and help young readers gain confidence.

As a principal who loves dogs I fully support this program and have seen its benefits to our students and staff. Please know the only dogs allowed on campus are therapy or service dogs. Even though your dog may be great around other people and animals, if it is not a service or therapy dog please do not bring it to school. I would hate to see an incident compromise the safety of our students and jeopardize our Reading to Rover program of trained therapy dogs.
